#### Deployment news (launched, ongoing, new): Volunteer/Project List

1. Seeds of Hope: Leslie/Shoreh: This is a new project and they need a volunteer with AGO expertise. Waiting on them to finalize the JD at this time.

- 2. GSDI Small Grants projects: need a volunteer to work on this.
- 3. <u>Compassion Games International:</u> Shoreh: The project is progressing very well. The volunteer has already the app up and running on the Amazon instance.
- 4. <u>GirlScouts Illinois: Shoreh:</u>Jon is done with geocoding and is now looking for a complete road centerline for modeling.
- 5. WWF-Zambia: Leslie: We had the kick-off meeting with WWF Water Stewardship Manager, WWF GIS analyst, Erin Goh Bing Bing the GISCorps volunteer and myself. The project is moving along on schedule and our volunteer and the WWF GIS analyst are working together to acquire the needed data and develop the story map ideas. The project is scheduled to end in mid-September but the Journey of Water day is in June and WWF asked to have the map finished by the end of April to publish when the JOW day was announced. This was not possible and WWF was informed that we need to stick to the September date; due to our volunteer's availability. It was noted in the April update that they would like the project to be complete by June for JOW day. This would cut the project time in half and will not be possible given the hours our volunteer has committed to. I will talk with our volunteer and see what options are available for finishing early; such as simplifying the map or having the WWF GIS analyst do more of the work. Given the outcome of the South African project I am reluctant to put any additional burden on our volunteer to meet a deadline that was not part of the project agreement.
- 6. <a href="WWF South Africa">WWF South Africa</a>: Leslie: completed. The report will be in the newsletter. This project officially ended in March but their media team did not like the map and is in the process of working with WWF international HQ to redesign the map. Currently the story map is not working correctly and our volunteer was hoping to submit it into the UC story map contest but could not. I was also going to do a UC presentation on the process of creating an interactive story map from a static website to help promote GISCorps but had to pull my presentation.
- 7. <u>USFS-Costa Rica</u> project Shoreh: the volunteer is back and sent a great report which will be included in the newsletter
- 8. <u>Sustainable Innovations</u>:German: One vol no longer available, moving forward with digitizing via Miami U students. Need a transition plan to recruit a project manager+more digitizers.
- 9. <u>Good Seed CDC</u>: Shoreh/German: Met with them again and decided to start the second phase. The second volunteer will finish the customization of the app.
- 10. <u>Community Solutions</u> (6 volunteers): Shoreh: CS' coordinator left the organization. Dave will coordinate until they hire someone. Project is progressing well.
